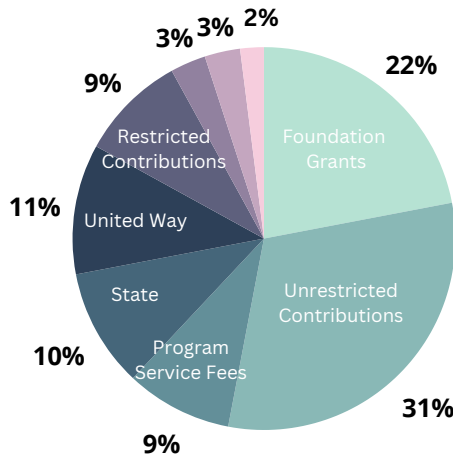
For the past 10 years, she has been the Finance Manager at The Donoho School. She is excited to be starting a new position with Marsh Troncale Wealth Management in May.

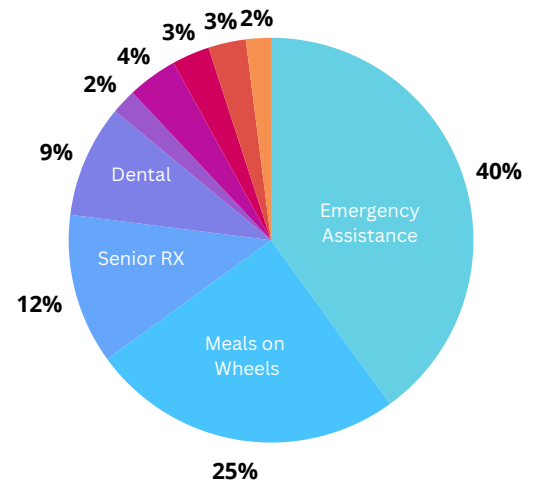

Think back to 1999, the end of the twentieth century. Teenage girls were wearing baggy pants with bare midriffs. Teenage boys wanted to be Neo from the movie "The Matrix". The adults were concerned with unknown changes brought by the new millennium, including all computers crashing from the Y2K bug, or possibly even the end of the world! (Nothing happened!)



That year of 1999 also saw some changes for Annette and Ronald Grant. Ronald retired at the age of 65, enabling him to spend time with Annette doing more of what they love – serving others in their community. That summer the Grants' church, First Baptist Church of Oxford, provided them an opportunity to sign up for variety of local volunteer opportunities. They chose Meals On Wheels, and have served the program faithfully for twenty-five years.

Back in 1999, the Grants jumped right in with their assigned route. However, as soon as they did, their daughter started a new job and needed help with her children. Undaunted, the Grants took on child care and still kept their MOW route. They took their grandchildren along on their route, still maintaining their MOW commitment while gaining valuable quality time with the youngsters.

Over the years, the Grants made deep connections with many of their Meals on Wheels clients. Annette fondly remembers the gentleman that, no matter what, always met them at his door with his fork in hand. Ronald became adept at programming TV remotes for clients who upgraded to cable TV, but who found their equipment confusing. And then there was the lady whose hands became severely disfigured with rheumatoid arthritis, rendering them almost useless. She could no longer easily prepare food for herself, so every Friday Ronald opened as many canned items as she would need over the weekend, placing them in her refrigerator and making sure she could access her food easily until Monday's MOW delivery.

After 25 years of ceaseless dedication, the Grants decided to retire from their MOW activities. The Grants have much to look forward to with their new free time, including celebrating Ronald's 90th birthday July 1, and traveling with family and friends. Annette and Ronald – a huge thank you for your service! You will be missed!
